Colleen Mitrow:

Colleen is an educator who long ago realised that many young people are marginalised in the school community and wider community. The traditional school system did not offer sufficient flexibility to enable these young people to overcome poverty, disadvantage, neglect and ongoing personal and family issues. Colleen is currently Principal of Hymba Yumba Community Hub in Springfield – a place of listening and learning. It is founded in the wisdom and precepts of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, however all young people, regardless of culture, religion and socio-economic position are welcome at this school.



Kathryn Brimblecombe-Fox:

Kathryn is a Brisbane-based visual artist. Her interests in cosmology, the age-old transcultural tree-of-life, existential risk and, more recently, the figure of the airborne military drone, inform her painterly considerations. Kathryn grew up on her parent's grain farm on the treeless black soil Pirrinyan Plain outside Dalby on the Darling Downs. Distance was palpable with relentless blue skies occasionally darkened by storm clouds. Night skies twinkled with stars, seemingly flung across black velvet. Her experience with distance informs her cosmic landscapes that extend horizons beyond Earth.



Jen Tucker:

Jen Tucker is a wife, a mother and an avid cyclist who is passionate about living a joyful life and helping others to do the same. On The 10th June, 2015 Jen was involved in a bicycle accident on Mt Nebo. The injuries she sustained were extensive. She spent a night in Intensive care and then three weeks as a patient at the Royal Brisbane Hospital. Her recovery has taken 2 years. Her accident and subsequent recovery has challenged her view of life. She is willing to share some of her experiences and lessons in the journey to maintain a happy and healthy life following this life changing event.
