God Loves Us, We Must Love Others

The first disciples were a little surprised that their ministry would extend beyond the bounds of the Jewish community – but that becomes the message that Peter is given, as the Gentile Cornelius receives the same Spirit as has been given to the disciples. Jesus did not come just to save the Jewish people; his salvation is for all.

God loves us first. God sent his Son to show us this love. God gave us commandments to help teach us how to love. It is love therefore that should be the hallmark of the Christian life. John goes so far as to say that "unless we love others we cannot claim to be children of God, or even to know God."

This call of love is not just for those who love us – it needs to be extended to all. Jesus loved the prostitutes and lepers, the tax collectors and Samaritans. Unfortunately, we have not learnt the lesson of the Apostles that God's love reaches beyond the church. We still exclude and marginalize the stranger and those who are different from us. (Think of the language used in Australia about refugees as one example. We might not use this language ourselves, but do we confront this language when it is used?) So we too are continually challenged to encounter Jesus in the outcast members of our society (and church). We are asked to love those who are on the margins and who are isolated from others.

We abide in God's love when we keep the commandments, because they are the foundation of our life together. The commandments give us the foundation of our values and morality. The commandments tell us to respect the stranger in our land ('remember that you too were once strangers in this land'); to forgive debts (at least every Jubilee Year, but also a key component of the Our Father prayer); to have respect for all life (this includes especially at the beginning and end of life, but also for all creatures whom God has made).

Toowong Parish has come full circle with the return of the Jesuits! When they first arrived in 1916, the parish included Indooroopilly and St Lucia. Over time, each suburb formed their own parish. In 2024, the three parishes have come together again to form a "Community of Communities".

To celebrate this historical moment, Toowong Parish is inviting you to join us on a bus trip to have lunch at Albert River Wines located at Tamborine.

The venue is the current home of Auchenflower House which once served as the Monastery for the Carmelite Order in Auchenflower.

The event will be scheduled between 16-22 June depending on the preferences of the majority of respondents.

The cost will be approximately \$50 per person which includes bus travel and a two-course lunch.
